Enriching Practical Reason

Abstract: I focus on an underappreciated problem with the idealized picture of practical reason. My aim is to provide an account of the nature of attitudes such as endorsements, commitments and the upshots of the process of self-reflection that do not typically figure in an idealized picture of the practically rational agent and are often thought to undermine practical deliberation. My suggestion is that a better understanding of the nature of these attitudes—namely, their distinctive features—will demonstrate that they do not hinder practical reason; they actually enrich it, given their ubiquity in the lives of actual agents.
